


# Member Spotlight Chadbourne Tavern

# A Message from the Executive Director

Downtown San Angelo is Back! We are well on our way from a challenging (to say the least) 2020!

As the Chadbourne Street Re-Design starts to wind down we have noticed an extra exuberance of citizen's enjoying the freedom to walk in and around the newly renovated streets and sidewalks. Even better news, merchants are reporting record breaking sales in the history of their businesses. Once again, proving this project was the right project for the time. It is a well-recognized fact within the Texas Main Street Program that once a community takes the leap to create a streetscape project, the results are dramatic not only from the aesthetic improvements, but where it counts the most at the bank!

Downtown San Angelo, Inc. was extremely proud to undertake the "Leading Lights and Historic Gateway Project" which was dedicated on March 3, 2021. The ceremony took place at the intersection of W. Concho Ave. and Randolph where the Historic Gateway was installed along with historic street light fixtures from the intersection of Koenigheim and W. Concho Ave.

We had the opportunity to "fill in a gap" twice over the last 6 months. The first event was the Reverse Christmas Parade which came about after the traditional Christmas Lights Parade cancelled due to COVID-19. After researching different options, our esteemed colleague Monica Ramos, Assistant Director came up with the Reverse Parade concept, which was a difficult task at best to undertake.

The second opportunity came when the San Angelo Symphony announced the cancellation of the July Pop's Concert. Within five weeks of seeking sponsors, putting together an All-Star lineup of bands and overcoming a rain storm that knocked out the electricity at the Bill Aylor River Stage, we had an exciting show featuring the San Angelo Community Band, Mariachi Alma Mexicana, The West Texas Jazz Orchestra and The United States Air Force Band of The West! Along with an After-Party Fleetwood Mac Tribute Band, Forever Mac! Oh-By the way, there were Fireworks too!!!

We are excited about new businesses that are coming online during 2021 that will again bring diversity to an already great group of retail, restaurants and nightlife in Downtown San Angelo!

# Up-and-Coming DSA Inc. Projects



### **Concho Avenue Gateway and Streetlights**

On April 28, 2021, the Downtown San Angelo, Inc. Leading Light and Gateway project was officially completed. The completion marked nearly 2 years since the initial proposal came to life. The dedication of the archway and lighting ceremony was held on May 3rd and recognized special donors who helped make the project possible.

Pedestrian safety and aesthetics are the most heavily impacted areas of improvement. Both citizens of our community and visitors may now walk a well-lit path at night. In addition to this, better lighting helps motorists by increasing visibility and safety. Quality materials consistent and complementary with historically used building materials will ensure that this project has a lasting effect on West Concho Avenue.

Again, DSA is extremely grateful to have received grant funding and private donations to make this project possible. Institutions such as the San Angelo Health Foundation, the San Angelo YMCA, First Financial Bank, and the San Angelo Area Foundation serve as leaders within our community.

### **Chadbourne Street Redesign**

Although not directly a Downtown San Angelo, Inc. project, the Chadbourne Street Redesign will play a large role in revitalizing the historic downtown neighborhood. The project is funded by grants from the Texas Department of Transportation and the City of San Angelo.

Inclement weather, heavy rainfall and Winter Storm Uri, hindered the onset of the process. Although despite the challenges, the Chadbourne Street Redesign has made great progress since the beginning of it's first phase. Currently, construction crews are on phase two of three.

The new street redesign will make the streets safer and more accessible to pedestrians. The sidewalks are spacious and ADA compliant This will allow for more foot traffic and bring increased patronage to businesses in the surrounding area.

Renovations and rehabilitation projects over the past few years have not only enhanced the appearance of many locations, but have also drawn an increased customer base. Downtown San Angelo advocated for the City of San Angelo's Tax Increment Reinvestment Program (TIRZ), which was created in 2006, to preserve the integrity of economic and social investment in the designated area and to encourage new projects. The TIRZ program may provide incentives for façade improvement, historic preservation, landscaping, egress, and/or sprinkler & smoke alarm installation. 
