Pursuing Downtown Development



Imagine the Possibilities Tour

In partnership with the Texas Historical Commission (THC) and the Texas Main Street Program (TMSP), Downtown San Angelo, Inc. invited potential

investors, downtown developers, entrepreneurs, and residents looking to be a part of downtown's "Imagine the Possibilities" transformation to explore available historic downtown properties. Included in the tour were the top floor of 109 S Chadbourne Street, the Household Furniture Building at 7-13 N Chadbourne Street, and 322 N Chadbourne Street, aka Burlap & Paisley.

The tour began with refreshments and an opening presentation focused on prime reasons to invest in San Angelo. Economic Anchors: San Angelo Regional Airport, Goodfellow Air Force Base, Shannon Health, Angelo State University and Howard College; Municipal Support & Investment: Concho River, Bill Aylor Memorial Riverstage, Museum of Fine Arts, Fort Concho, Chadbourne Streetscape, and Consistent increase in number of businesses.

Keynote speakers from First Financial Bank, Gossett, Millican & Harrison, and the City of San Angelo

touched on useful tips related to commercial lending, deed process, and city permitting process. Each attendee was provided with packets including references to topics discussed, a Construction Permit Checklist, Central Business District Zoning details, and Design & Historic Review Commission information & application. Among the handouts was a list of Available Incentives for property seekers to take advantage of like Tax Increment Reinvestment Program, Main Street Design Assistance, and Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credits.

Overall, the Imagine the Possibilities Tour passed on a sense of appreciation for historic preservation. Our guests were able to see with their own eyes, the beauty of historic properties and understand that modern can be combined with historic elements to create an inviting atmosphere.

Historic Oakes Street Bridge

What's happening?

On June 5, 2023, the historic Oakes Street Bridge was closed to traffic as it undergoes repairs and reinforcement construction. Surface work will include deck preservation and reconstruction of the approaches on either side of the bridge. On the underside of the bridge, work will include concrete repairs and painting.



Per the Texas Department of Transportation, the project is part of TxDOT's Bridge Maintenance & Improvement Program which is a federally funded program that allows local governments to apply for funding from the State of Texas. The City of San Angelo applied to receive funding assistance for the repairs. Of the \$1.2 million dollar improvements, TxDOT will pay for 90% and the City will pay for 10%.

The closure is expected to last nine months and is from Concho Avenue to Allen Street. Detours will be in place to guide traffic.

History of the Oakes Street Bridge

Spanning the North Concho River in San Angelo, this bridge was constructed in 1930. The purpose of this bridge was to replace the long overdue steel truss bridge that had been standing since 1880. This 472-foot-long bridge consists of 11 spans of continuous variable depth concrete girders resting on massive two and three column concrete piers. The curved line of the girders is repeated in miniature along the scalloped fascia walls placed along the outside of the deck. Noted bridge engineer, Francis Hughes of Dallas, designed the new concrete bridge to complement the nearby 1924 concrete curved beam Murphy Bridge on Beauregard Avenue. During his career as a consultant, he worked on the following projects:

Trinity River Bridges (eighteen), Tarrant Co., Tx.
Belknap Street Viaduct, Ft. Worth, Tx.
Triple Underpass, Dallas, Tx.
T.A.T. shop and hanger, Love Field, Dallas, Tx.



These projects are what made him a notable engineer. Therefore, the Oakes Street Bridge is significant as the only example of a concrete bridge in West Texas designed by a renowned bridge engineer.




