"Ewe"**



Built in 1946, this building was previously home to former Star Lanes Bowling Alley. About 40 years of vacancy after the bowling alley shut down, the building was revitalized by Art in Uncommon Places and is now home to an outdoor museum.

In 1931 this place was home to Jesse York Auto Repair. Years later, it became Memory Lane, a fine antique store. How uncanny this name is compared to the current store name. Perhaps it is something very familiar or has to do with something that has happened before.

If your car needed a tune up or repairs, you would pull into the garage of the Shook Tire Company. This building still stands today, among 2 other tire services centers within proximity.

From 1895 to 1949, Findlater hardware was owned by an Irish immigrant by the name of John Findlater. In 1949 the business was sold and became Hicks and Puckitt Hardware. Later becoming Mr. H. G. Wendland's early sheet metal plant and home of his business, Wendland Manufacturing.

In 1884, Veck Sterret and Co Bank, owned by William S Veck, was introduced. A year later, according to a local newspaper article, an employee of the bank on the second floor left his furnace on when he left the building the night before. A fire emerged and caused minimal damage to the building. The building was later demolished; its current use being a parking lot where you can park to walk around downtown or visit the Western shoe store next door.

The San Angelo National Bank opened in 1884 on saloon property that was owned by John Nasworthy. The bank later moved to a new location in 1903. The historic character of the original San Angelo National Bank was kept intact over the years thanks to a cable television pioneer and historic preservationist, Ken Gunter, and his spouse.

This is where the legal proceedings of Tom Green County take place. Previously, there were several other versions of this building, the first being built in 1876 in Ben Ficklin. Unfortunately, this building was destroyed in the flood of 1882. A replacement legal building was built in 1882 and was quickly damaged by yet another flood about 6 months after its completion. The current and fourth rendition of the building was built downtown in 1928 by Anton F.

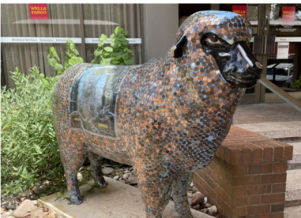
Initially established in 1932 from a financial foundation created by J.M. Shannon and Margaret Shannon. It is the largest locally based healthcare provider for Concho Valley and surrounding regions and serves over 180,000 people.

The first research and reading area was established in 1902 by the San Angelo Women's club and placed in the rear of Wingfield Drug Store. This building used to be a Hemphill-Wells before it was transformed in 2005 to what we know it as today. It also underwent a complete renovation in 2011.

Prior to the Central National Bank, St. Angelus Hotel stood in its place. It was built in 1917 and eventually demolished in 1964 after almost 50 years of service. The Central National Bank stood in its place after being completed in 1966. The building has since been sold and is currently used for banking and office space.

This house is on the National Register of Historic Places due to its architecture style, Spanish Eclectic. It was a 1925 Spanish colonial home initially built for physician H.R. Wardlaw and his family. In 1961, the property was purchased to be used as headquarters for an association dedicated to production agriculture.

Before becoming a 14-story structure, the Titus Machine and Tool Company resided on the plot of land on Twohig Ave. In 1928, an elegant and extravagant resting place opened its doors to travelers. In 1963, the building was donated to the Baptist Memorial Center as a home for the elderly. Today, this large structure is a hot spot for formal events, meetings, dining, and spaces for lease.

Built in 1929, first responders worked out of this space for almost 50 years. During the flood of 1936, the building was in about 8 feet of water but despite this, its occupants continued to assist with helping the citizens of San Angelo. The station was operational until it closed in 1976.
